

Summerfest in the City: Celebrating the Beginning of Summer with Art and Music

Virginia-Highland Summerfest 2011 Saturday June 4th and Sunday, June 5th

The Virginia-Highland Civic Association is proud to present the 28th annual Virginia-Highland Summerfest, June 4-5, 2011.

Visitors to Summerfest can celebrate the beginning of summer by shopping for original art in a variety of media — and by enjoying great food and an exceptional array of live music presented by radio station partner 929 dave fm (92.9 FM). This year's event also features a 5K race on Saturday morning, along with activities designed for children in the Kidsfest area in John Howell Park, adjacent to Arcadia.

Summerfest takes place along tree-lined Virginia Avenue, in the heart of the historic and charming Virginia-Highland neighborhood. Regularly recognized by local media as one of Atlanta's best neighborhood festivals and consistently revered by art professionals as one of the best artists' markets in the southeast, Summerfest is a great event for the entire family.

Arts: The juried artist market features work and exhibits from more than 220 of the best artists in the southeast and beyond, in a variety of media including painting, clay, glass, jewelry, photography, printmaking, fiber, wood, metal and mixed media.

Race: The Summerfest 5K is held at 8 a.m. on Saturday and features more than 1,000 runners winding through the neighborhood streets of Virginia-Highland. Following the 5K Race, children ages 5 and younger will run, waddle or crawl to the finish line of the Tot Trot held in Inman Middle School field at 8:45 a.m.

Registration for the 5K and Tot Trot must be made in advance. See www.active.com to register with a credit card or running4fitness.com for details.

Music: The 92.9 dave fm music stage will feature a variety of renowned local musicians, along with nationally acclaimed singer songwriters.

Kidsfest: This year's Kidsfest will take place in John Howell Park adjacent to Arcadia on Saturday (10 a.m. to 5 p.m.) and Sunday (noon to 5 p.m.). A variety of artistic activities, music and many other activities will be offered for children.

Parking: There is a limited mix of free parking lots, paid parking lots, and designated on-street parking. See www.vahi.org/summerfest. html for information on transportation and parking options.

MARTA: Take the MARTA train to Midtown Station. Walk east on 10th street until it dead-ends into Monroe. Turn right onto Monroe. Turn left at the first traffic light onto Virginia. Walk up Virginia until you see Summerfest. The distance from Midtown MARTA is approximately 1 mile.

Surviving cancer takes not only a physical toll but an emotional one as well. Here are some frequently asked questions cancer survivors face.

1. How can I cope with my fear of cancer recurring?

Learning about your cancer and what you can do to take care of your body can give you a sense of control. Acknowledging your feelings can help you sort them out and may help you let them go. Being as active as possible can help you focus on other things and take your mind off cancer and the worries it brings.

2. What are signs that I should seek professional help for depression?

Some signs that may indicate you need professional help for depression include

- feelings of worry, sadness, and hopelessness that don't go away
- feeling overwhelmed or out of control for long periods of time
- crying for a long time or many times a day
- thinking about hurting or killing yourself
- loss of interest in usual activities.

3. Why does my family treat me differently than they did before I had cancer?

Your loved ones may not understand your feelings and may not be prepared for the fact that recovery can be a slow process. When treatment is over, they may expect you to be enthusiastic about getting on with your life. They also may feel the need to get back to a normal life.

4. How can I ensure good communication with family and loved ones?

Communicating with family and loved ones is important, and you should give yourself time to adjust to changes in the way you communicate. If you need more support, call your friends or family instead of waiting for them to call you.

Sometimes it's necessary to seek outside help. Ask your doctor to refer you to a counselor who can help you communicate with your loved ones. Join a support group if you feel that talking with other survivors who have gone through similar experiences would be helpful. Support groups are also available for loved ones of cancer survivors.

5. Where can I get more information about cancer survivorship issues?

The National Cancer Institute's Cancer Information Service (CIS) provides personalized answers to questions about many aspects of cancer, including symptoms, diagnosis, treatment and survivorship issues. 
