

# MAY IS MELANOMA/SKIN CANCER DETECTION AND PREVENTION MONTH

According to the American Academy of Dermatology, many people do not examine their skin for changes that could be the warning signs of skin cancer despite that fact that it is the only cancer that can be seen on the surface of the skin. Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the U.S., reports the National Institute of Health. It occurs in more than a million people each year, including many older people. There are three main types of skin cancer: basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma and melanoma. Of the three, melanoma is the most serious.

#### **Reducing Your Risk**

While exposure to UV radiation is a major risk factor for cancer, skin cancer can occur anywhere on the skin, not just in sun-exposed areas.

The best ways to reduce your risk of skin cancer are to:

- avoid outdoor activities during midday, when the sun's rays are strongest, or
- to wear protective clothing such as a widebrimmed hat, long-sleeved shirt and pants.

Darker-colored clothing is more protective against the sun. For example, a white t-shirt, particularly if it gets wet, provides little resistance to UV rays. In addition, wearing sunglasses that wrap around the face or have large frames is a good way to shield the delicate skin around the eyes.

#### Wear Sunscreen and Lipscreen

When exposed to sunlight, you should always wear sunscreen and lipscreen. If possible, choose sunscreen and lipscreen labeled "broadspectrum" (to protect against UVA and UVB rays). Your sunscreen should have an SPF, or sun protection rating, of at least 30. The SPF of a sunscreen is a measure of the time it takes to produce a sunburn in a person wearing sunscreen compared to the time it takes to produce a sunburn in a person not wearing sunscreen. This varies from person to person, so be sure to reapply sunscreen every 2-3 hours.

Some sunscreens can contain toxic chemicals that aren't necessary for fighting UV rays. Some experts think these chemicals might do our bodies more harm than good. Each year, the Environmental Working Group (EWG) publishes a list of the top, least chemical filled sunscreens. The 2011 list is available at http://breakingnews. ewg.org/2011sunscreen/best-sunscreens/bestbeach-sport-sunscreens/.

#### **Detecting Skin Cancer**

The American Academy of Dermatology reports, "The best way to find skin cancer in its earliest, most treatable stage is by checking your skin regularly and having a dermatologist perform a full-body skin cancer screening."

Each spring, the American Academy of Dermatology teams up with local dermatologists to offer free skin cancer screenings. A screening is simply a visual examination of your skin – and it can save your life.

This year, a free screening is scheduled for May 16 at Kaiser Permanente Cumberland Dermatology at 2525 Cumberland Pkwy., in Atlanta. Screening hours are 8 a.m. -3:30 p.m. Walk-ins are welcome. # Make It a Margarita May

#### **Ultimate Frozen Strawberry Margarita**

- 8 ounces frozen sliced strawberries in syrup
- 4 fluid ounces frozen limeade concentrate\*

Fill a blender with ice and crush. Add the strawberries and limeade. Blend for 30 seconds or until smooth. Serve in margarita glasses with the rims dipped in powdered sugar.

\* For a traditional version of this beverage, add 6 fluid ounces of tequila and 2 fluid ounces of triple sec. Add to crushed ice before strawberries and limeade.

#### Jewel's Watermelon Margaritas

- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 3 strips orange zest
- 2 cups cubed seeded watermelon
- 3/4 cup lemon lime soda\*
- 1/4 cup lime juice
- salt or sugar for rimming glasses (optional)
- 1 lime, cut into wedges
- 2 cups crushed ice, or as needed
- 1. Bring 1/2 cup sugar, water, and orange zest in a small saucepan to boil, stirring constantly. Simmer until sugar is dissolved, about 3 minutes. Remove simple syrup from heat and allow to cool completely.
- 2. Place watermelon in a blender or food processor. Pulse until pureed.
- 3. Stir watermelon puree into a large pitcher with simple syrup, lemon lime soda, and lime juice.
- 4. Place a small amount of salt or sugar into a saucer. Rub edge of margarita glasses with a lime wedge to moisten. Lightly dip the rim of the glass into the saucer to rim the glass; tap off excess salt or sugar.
- 5. Fill rimmed glasses with crushed ice; pour margarita mixture into glasses and garnish with lime wedges to serve.
- \* For a traditional version of this beverage, replace lemon lime soda with white tequila.

#### **DEAR FRIENDS & NEIGHBORS,**

In the real estate market back in 2007, buyers would often pay asking price and sometimes higher if there was another offer on the property. Today... well, not so much. What a difference a couple of years make. With the real estate bubble burst and foreclosures flooding the market, buyers now have the upper hand.

But as a seller, you can take steps to get a fair price for your home. An article I was just reading discussed the 10 buyer turnoffs that sellers should avoid at all costs.

- Dirt. Nothing turns a buyer off more quickly than a dirty house. Get your house in the best condition before putting it on the market. If the carpets are old and smelly, then you should put in new. Clean relatively new carpets. The home should be clean and neat and free of debris.
- 2. Odors. Buyers buy with their noses. Keep kitchen odors at bay. Avoid frying smelly food while your home is on the market. Take pets out frequently to avoid accidents.
- 3. Old fixtures. Updated cabinet hardware and door knobs can make a big difference. Also replace dated light fixtures and ceiling fans.
- 4. Wallpaper. A definite no-no. Remove it or paint over it.
- 5. Popcorn acoustic ceilings. These can badly date your space.
- 6. Too many personal items. Sellers should eliminate personal items, including family photos, personal effects and even some unique colors. Potential buyers get distracted by family photos. If you want to hook a buyer, strategically place a mirror so they can see themselves in the home and imagine themselves living there.
- 7. Snoopy sellers. Please do not stay home when the property is being shown. Potential buyers feel uncomfortable and tend to spend less time there.
- 8. Misrepresenting your home.
- 9. Poor curb appeal. Make the buyer want the home as soon before they hit the front door.
- 10. Clutter. Closets should be half full with nothing on the floor. Kepp nothing on the kitchen counters and keep bookshelves divided into thirds: 1/3 books, 1/3 vases and pictures and 1/3 empty.

If you stage your home correctly and price your home right, your home should sell.
